Howell Cheney Technical High School will offer a structured academic and enrichment After School Program. Cheney Tech staff members are the core part of the program. Your son/daughter will be able to work on their challenging assignments and/or utilize technology with the assistance of Cheney Tech teachers. We believe this will serve to strengthen skills and improve outcomes. In addition, they will have the opportunity to enroll in an enrichment activity if they maintain good academic standing; a grade of 75 or above in all courses.

It is scheduled to begin Wednesday, November 16, 2016. Academic assistance for your son/daughter will run on Monday and Wednesday afternoons from 2:15 – 4:15 as well as the following Saturdays from 8am – 12pm in the Cheney Tech Library Media Center.
